

* * SUMMARY PARAGRAPHS EXPLAINING CLIENT'S ATTAINED SCALE SCORES * *

TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:74
This person's response pattern on the Truthfulness Scale is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Truth-Corrected scores should be accurate, however, there is the possibility of some distortion. A conscious or perhaps subconscious attempt to present self in an overly favorable light is evident. This person is defensive and guarded regarding self-disclosure. Denial and resistance to further inquiry and self-report can be anticipated. This individual is self-protective and minimizing self-report information.

ALCOHOL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:85
This person's response pattern on the Alcohol Scale is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Alcohol use and abuse is indicated. Alcohol abuse may be a focal issue in this person's adjustment problems. Either this person is a recovering alcoholic, or an established pattern of alcohol abuse is indicated. RECOMMENDATIONS: Consideration might be given to moderately intensive probation including personal reporting. Individual or group counseling and/or Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) participation on at least a weekly basis could be helpful. A firm probationary structure with a counseling or self-help component is desirable.

CONTROL SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:98
This person's scale score is in the Severe Problem (90 to 100th percentile) risk range. Focal issues involve control of self and others. Severe problem risk scorers are often described as domineering, bullying, dictatorial and abusive. Family members may live in terror of this person's temper, anger and violence. This person's significant other may be held in bondage through intimidation and raw violence. This person's court records should be reviewed for a history or pattern of domestic violence. Counseling, anger management or psychotherapy appear warranted.

DRUGS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:83
This person's response pattern on the Drugs Scale is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Drug use or abuse is indicated and may be a focal issue in this person's adjustment problems. Either this person is a recovering (drug problem, but has stopped using) drug user, or manifests an established pattern of drug abuse. RECOMMENDATIONS: Consideration might be given to moderately intensive probation, personal reporting and counseling (individual or group), with supplemental Narcotics Anonymous (NA) or Cocaine Anonymous (CA) meetings. This is a problem risk Drugs Scale score.

VIOLENCE SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:86
This person's response pattern on the Violence Scale is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem risk scorers are capable of committing acts of physical, emotional or verbal abuse. They frequently have communication difficulties and family/relationship problems. Many harbor a lot of poorly repressed resentment, anger and even hostility. RECOMMENDATIONS: Structure characterized by clearly understood behavioral expectations and consequences should be considered, along with close supervision. When upset (or during periods of substance abuse), this person's emotions all too easily interfere with his or her judgment. Family or domestic violence counseling or anger management program involvement is needed. When under perceived

stress this individual could be assaultive and potentially dangerous.

STRESS COPING SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:73

This person's response pattern on the Stress Coping Abilities Scale is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem risk scorers are not coping effectively with the stress, tension, anxiety and pressure. Symptoms of stress include irritability, depression, anxiety, substance abuse and marital/family problems. RECOMMENDATIONS: Stress management counseling would be helpful. This person should adjust his or her lifestyle to incorporate adequate sleep, nutrition, regular exercise and enjoyable leisure time.

- 46. Admits has drinking problem

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- 2. Sometimes can't control self
- 10. Admits a violent temper
- 36. Lot's of arguments and fights
- 69. Temper a moderate problem

CONTROL

- 8. Told is controlling
- 19. Usually controls others
- 23. Often shouts and demands
- 41. Often loses control

MULTIPLE CHOICE: These answers, with all of their biases, are the answers selected by the client.

- 69. Temper problem: moderate
- 70. Drinking problem: slight
- 71. Alcohol treatment: may need
- 72. D.V. problem: slight
- 73. D.V. counseling: not sure
- 74. Drug problem: no problem
- 75. Drug treatment: unmotivated
- 76. Past year: not dangerous
